Kakadu National Park Entry Fee

The entry fee for Kakadu National Park is \$40 per adult (15 May-31 Oct) & \$25 per adult (01 Apr-14 May & 01 Nov-31 Mar) and \$20 per child (15 May-31 Oct) and \$12.50 per child (01 Apr-14 May & 01 Nov-31 Mar) and is valid for 7 consecutive days. Child age is 5 to 15 years. This is an additional compulsory government charge and is subject to change without notice.







Litchfield National Park Waterfalls

FULL DAY

D5

Established in 1986, Litchfield National Park is a stunning location. You can take in the splendour of thundering waterfalls, rainforest pockets and historic sacred sites. It is a haven for hundreds of native bird species and the plateau supports a rich range of woodland flora. The traditional custodians of the Park are the Wagait people, many of whom still call the area home.

- On the way to your first stop in the town of Batchelor, your Driver Guide will keep you entertained with stories surrounding the history of Australia's longest highway, the Stuart
- Batchelor is the gateway to Litchfield National Park and you'll stop here for a morning tea break at one of the local cafés (own expense)
- Stop for a photo at the Termite Mounds, the work of local termites, standing upright like magnetic compasses
- View the double waterfalls of Florence Falls from a high vantage point before making your way down to take a dip in the plunge pool below
- There's time for an interpretive walk through the scenic bush and monsoon vine forest
- Continue to spectacular Tolmer Falls, home to several colonies of rare ghost and orange horseshoe bats
- Take a break for lunch at Litchfield Café
- Wangi Falls is the most accessible of rock pools and is the perfect place for you to take a final dip today
- Visit Howard Springs Nature Park, a great place to see wildlife including turtles, barramundi and freshwater fish

Katherine Gorge Cruise & Edith Falls

Katherine Gorge is located within amazing Nitmiluk National Park, which spans more than 292,000 hectares. With rugged landscapes, thundering waterfalls and unlimited flora and fauna, Nitmiluk is a haven for adventurers and nature lovers alike. The name Nitmiluk, meaning 'Cicada Place', came from the Jawoyn people who are the traditional custodians of the Park.

- Travel along Australia's longest highway, the Stuart, on your way into Nitmiluk National Park and Katherine Gorge
- Stop at the Adelaide River War Cemetery, dedicated to those who lost their lives in the north of Australia during WWII



Darwin City Sights

HALF DAY

Darwin is Australia's only tropical capital city and is the largest city in the Northern Territory. It is a former frontier outpost and the gateway to Kakadu National Park. Darwin is treasured country to its traditional owners, the Larrakia people, who are prominent and active members of the local community. A multicultural city, it boasts a population made up of people from more than 60 nationalities and 70 different ethnic backgrounds.

- Throughout the tour, your Driver Guide will entertain you with stories about Darwin's colourful history
- Visit Darwin Aviation Museum and see a B-52 Bomber, on permanent loan from the United States Air Force, among the 19 aircraft on display
- View some rare amateur footage of the first air-raid on Darwin and original footage from Japanese archives
- Explore the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory and see the largest permanent display of Aboriginal artwork in Australia
- Stroll through the Darwin (George Brown) Botanic Gardens, one of the few in the world which has marine and estuarine plants naturally in its grounds. You'll have the chance to see some unique exotic plants and also some local wildlife

This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to visit a modern-day Aboriginal community. It will provide you with an insight into the Tiwi people's rich culture and lifestyle. The tour will reveal scenes seldom seen by many outsiders and will leave you with a lifetime memory. Many cities are blessed with island destinations close by, but only Darwin has the Tiwi Islands.

- Take a 2½-hour cruise aboard the Tiwi Mantawi to Bathurst Island. You'll be met by your local guide and taken on a journey through the progressive, modern day Aboriginal community of Wurrumiyanga

Day 2 Kakadu – Katherine

Warradjan Cultural Centre for an insight into the local Bininj culture. Later, join your local guide for a cruise on Yellow Water Billabona. Kakadu's most famous wetland and home to saltwater crocodiles and dozens of species of colourful birdlife. Before arriving in Katherine, stop at Leliyn (Edith Falls), whose pandanus-fringed natural pool is suitable for swimming throughout most of the year (conditions permitting). Hotel: ibis Styles, Katherine, L.

Day 3 Katherine – Depart Darwin

Enjoy a morning cruise through Katherine Gorge, a stunning network of thirteen gorges carved from billion-year-old sandstone. You'll be at its heart among freshwater crocodiles, wonderful birdlife and amazing scenery. Later, view the displays at the Nitmiluk Visitor Centre, where you may purchase artefacts handmade by the Jawoyn people. Return to Darwin, stopping at historic gold mining town of Pine Creek and the poignant Adelaide River War Cemetery. Your Short Break concludes this evening. B

Day 2 Guluyambi Culture Cruise – Depart Darwin

Head off with your Driver Guide to explore the World Heritage area of Ubirr, where you'll explore extensive Aboriginal rock art galleries believed to be 20,000 years old, and considered among the best in the world. Climb to the lookout for stunning views over the floodplains, woodlands and dark ribbons of rainforest of

the surrounding Nadab wetlands. Then take the Guluyambi Cultural Cruise along the East Alligator River, where an Aboriginal guide will provide insights into their culture, including local mythology, the river's abundant food chain, as well as bush survival skills. With special permission of the local people, you are able to go ashore in Arnhem Land. Visit Bowali Visitor Centre, which houses a wealth of information on the Park's ecology and Aboriginal culture. Return to Darwin, where your Short Break concludes. L


